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2009 Rehearsal – Communal Establishments

1. Definition and scope for rehearsal

A Communal Establishment (CE) is defined for census purposes as an establishment providing managed accommodation. The main types of communal establishment are:

- Health and Care Establishments (including includes National Health Service (NHS) and private hospitals and hospices, care homes, nursing homes, residential homes, mental health establishments, children's homes, maternity units and rehabilitation centres);
- Access Restricted Establishments (prisons, military and others such as consulates and royal households);
- Educational Establishments (including university halls of residence, boarding schools, residential schools for disabled children, theological and training colleges); and
- Other Managed Establishments (includes hotels, guest houses, bed and breakfasts, health farms, holiday camps, youth hostels).

CEs therefore require different enumeration procedures to households and the scope for the rehearsal was to test these for each type of CE, trialling for the first time the use of Communal Establishment Enumerators (CEen).

What was tested:

- use of CEens;
- procedures for enumerating:
 - Ministry of Defence (MOD) establishments;
 - prisons; and
 - student accommodation.
- enumeration of care homes and hospitals (no special procedures put in place);
- interface with Foreign and Commonwealth Office (re protocol letter and list of current Consulate Generals in Scotland);
- use of CEen Enumerator Record Book (ERB);
- reconciliation procedures for CE questionnaires ;
- allocation of work to CEens; and
- pay rate for CEens.

What could not be tested:

• enumeration of Royal Households; and enumeration of Hostels.

3. Other evaluation points

Description	Outcomes/issues	Recommendation(s)
6) Universities/ boarding schools	Due to the timing of the census rehearsal some universities and boarding schools were on holiday. This led to a poor response rate from those in the rehearsal area.	 Ensure that questionnaires are delivered in good time to universities/schools. Investigate options for the enumeration of university accommodation including the possibility of online returns for students.
7) Enumeration of MOD establishments	The enumeration of the MOD establishment in the rehearsal was not a success. No questionnaires were returned despite a letter advising of the rehearsal and a Defence Instruction Notice (DIN) being issued by the MOD.	Work with the MOD to identify an appropriate solution.
8) Enumeration of hospitals and care homes	Several care homes did not respond, citing the amount of work which it would involve.	 The compulsory nature of the census should resolve this issue in 2011. CTLs will be able to offer guidance and support.
