- October 2015 to January 2016
- 113 responses 91 organisations, 22 individuals
- Published responses February 2016
- Published report 15 August 2016





Approach to consultation

- Building on the success and evaluation of 2011
- Considering new topics BUT constraints on length of questionnaire will remain
- Changes to address:
- Where questions didn't work well
- New or emerging policy requirements
- Changes in legislation and international guidance
- Working with colleagues across the UK to harmonise where required





'Further work required'

- Sexual orientation
- Income
- Reason for migration

Additional topics suggested:

- Ex-Service community
- Gender identity





Next steps

- User requirements and set of considerations steer the development of the questionnaire
- Undertake research and small-scale question testing
 - ➤ Data quality
 - ➤ Public acceptability
 - > Respondent burden
 - > Financial considerations
 - Questionnaire design





Collaboration with ONS and NISRA

- Involved in ONS stakeholder event (August)
- Joint commissioning public acceptability research
- Sharing of findings from Census 2017 test





Public acceptability research

Short survey to ask views around including a question in Census.

Not asked to reveal your own sexual orientation/ gender identity.

10,000 Scottish households randomly selected from postal address file





Next steps

- Share outcome of meeting with attendees
- Identify key issues to take forward in decision on inclusion of a question in Scotland's Census 2021
- Develop action plan which may include further discussions with stakeholders
- Share findings from research and testing with stakeholders
- Continue working with colleagues across the UK to harmonise where required
