Key Actions

1. NRS provided a summary of the drop-in meeting that took place since the last full ISG meeting:

20th July 2023

At this short meeting, the information that ISG required to be able to make a statement at the time of first release was discussed. NRS agreed to provide ISG with the required information, including results from the estimation modelling and findings from the subsequent quality assurance at the next full meeting.

2. NRS provided an overview on some of the key changes from the original design for estimating the population developed with ISG. These included:
 - Use of a logistic regression model to estimate the number of usual residents and households
 - Supplementing the Census Coverage Survey with admin data
 - Use of admin data for Communal Establishments
 - Use of the Alternative Household Estimate for bias adjustment and Quality Assurance
 - Adjustments made during modelling – for babies, school age children and households in some local authorities.
3. ISG provided the steer that care is needed on the explanation of the household adjustment being applied. NRS to reconsider the presentation of the rationale for making this adjustment.
4. NRS to have a deep dive at sub-LA level in the areas where there were differences from the household estimates.
5. NRS then presented on how the predictors of non-response for the regression models used to estimate usual residents and households were selected.
6. ISG asked for more information on the household adjustment and the modelling approach.
