# Scotland's Census 2011 Data quality for coverage records 

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## 1. Introduction

Although every care was taken to record as much of the population of Scotland during the 2011 Census as possible, a number of people and households went unrecorded. In order to produce accurate population and household estimates based on the census, these missing people and households were taken into account by generating artificial census records to fill the gaps (Generated records are also sometimes referred to as imputed records.) Estimating the number of generated records required was done using a smaller follow-up survey - the Census Coverage Survey - to estimate the number of people who did not complete the census. The details of the Census Coverage Survey are available in the report: How the 2011 Census population estimates were obtained.

As part of the census process, records for both households and people were generated. Out of the total estimated population of 5,295,000 in Scotland's Census 2011, 336,000 people ( 6.4 per cent) were accounted for by generated records. Similarly, 159,000 ( 6.7 per cent) of the total estimated number of 2,373,000 households were accounted for by generated records. These proportions of generated person and household records are higher than the corresponding proportions in the 2001 Census, when 3.9 per cent of people and 3.3 per cent of households were accounted for by generated records.

Generated people were either placed in already existing households or into entirely generated households. The rate of non-recording in the census was not evenly spread across the population of Scotland, and certain groups and geographical areas may have disproportionately greater non-response rates (for example, younger people and students). As a result of these different response rates, a greater proportion of generated census records exist for these categories, which can negatively affect the quality of estimates for these groups if the generation rate is very high. (In this report the term 'generation rate' is used to mean the percentage of people or households which were generated records)

This report highlights the level of generated records across a number of different geographical and population groupings. The aim of this is to provide users of census products with information about where generation rates may have an effect on the accuracy of census estimates for these areas and groups.

## 2. Geography

### 2.1 Generated people by council area

In one third of the 32 council areas in Scotland, the proportion of the total estimated population based on generated records was less than 5 per cent, while in almost two thirds this proportion was between 5 and 10 per cent. Only in one council area Glasgow City - was 10 per cent or more of the total estimated population based on generated records.

### 2.2 Generated households by council area

In 44 per cent of the council areas, generated household records accounted for less than 5 per cent of the total estimated number of households, while in a further 53 per cent of council areas they accounted for between 5 and 10 per cent of the total. Only in one council area - Glasgow City - were 10 per cent or more of the total estimated number of households accounted for by generated household records.

### 2.3 Generated people by data zone

The proportion of the total estimated population accounted for by generated person records, or generation rate, varied widely across Scotland's data zones (all statistics in this report are based on the 2011 data zones, see quick guide to data zone 2001 and 2011 matching for details). Almost half of the 6,976 data zones had a generation rate of less than five per cent. However, nearly 15 per cent of data zones had generation rates of greater than 10 per cent. (See Annex 1 for maps).

### 2.4 Generated households by data zones

Almost half of the 6,976 data zones in Scotland had less than five per cent of their total estimated number of households based on generated household records.

## 3. Characteristics of generated people

### 3.1 Sex

Of the total estimated male population of 2,567,000 in Scotland's Census 2011, 181,000 ( 7.0 per cent) were based on generated records. The corresponding generation rate for females was slightly lower: 156,000 (5.7 per cent) of the total estimated female population of $2,728,000$ were based on generated records.

### 3.2 Age

The generation rate was highest for people in the age groups between 20 and 29 years old, at more than 11 per cent. It was lowest for age groups of 50 and over, at under 4 per cent.

### 3.3 Age and sex

Generation rates are higher for males than for females at each age group considered, other than for children under 5 years old.

### 3.4 Country of birth

Respondents were sorted into broad geographic regions based on the country of their birth. All groups of people born outside of the UK had generation rates higher than the overall population. The highest generation rate was for people born in Africa (18.0 per cent) followed by people born in Middle East and Asia (15.7 per cent).

### 3.5 Ethnic group

The reported ethnicity of respondents was sorted into broad categories. The highest generation rates were for respondents in the African or Caribbean or Black ethnic groups - at 26.6 per cent and 27.0 per cent respectively.

### 3.6 Residence type

The generation rates for people living in communal establishments (such as care homes, prisons and student halls of residence) and in private households were very similar - 6.2 per cent and 6.4 per cent respectively.

### 3.7 Communal establishment type

At 24 per cent, prisons had much the highest generation rate for the different categories of communal establishment.

### 3.8 Living arrangements

Substantial differences in the generation rate existed between people with different living arrangements. Only 2 per cent of married people living as a couple were based on generated person records. The corresponding proportions for people who were married or in a registered same-sex civil partnership but not living in a couple was 20.5 per cent.

### 3.9 Gaelic

Generation rates for different groups of people by their Gaelic skill set ranged from 5.4 for those who could speak but not read or write Gaelic to 9.0 per cent for those who could read but not speak or write Gaelic.

### 3.10 Economic activity

Figure 10 shows that generation rates for different groups of people by economic activity varied from 2.5 per cent for retired people to 14.4 per cent for (economically inactive) students.

## 4. Household Characteristics

### 4.1 Generated people by tenure of household

The proportion of generated people varied greatly by their housing tenure, with the highest generation rate ( 16.6 per cent) being for those renting from a private landlord. By contrast, the proportion of generated person records was relatively low for owner occupied households, with only a 2.9 per cent generation rate for people who owned their home outright.

### 4.2 Generated households by tenure

Owner occupied households had relatively low proportions of generated household records, at 2.8 per cent and 3.9 per cent respectively for the Owned Outright and Owned with a Mortgage categories. This contrasts with generally higher generation rates for households in rented accommodation, with the highest generation rate of 17.9 per cent being for households which were renting from a private landlord.

### 4.3 Generated people by household size

The generation rate for people was highest for those in single person households (11.3 per cent), and lowest for those people in four person households (4.6 per cent).

### 4.4 Generated households by household size

The variation by household size in the generation rate for households was broadly similar to that of the generation rate for people. The highest rate (11.3 per cent) was for single person households. The generation rate was 6.0 per cent or lower for all other household size categories, with the lowest rate being for four person households, at 3.3 per cent.
